

SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

School Targets

- The target, based on MAP performance for all students in all grades will increase from 38.6% to 46.6%.
- The target, based on MAP performance for ELL students in all grades will increase from 23.1% to 31.1%.
- The target, based on end of year F&P benchmark levels for all students in all grades K-2, will increase from 79.6% to 83.6% by the end of the 2017-18 school year.
- The target, based on end of year F&P benchmark levels for ELL in grades K-5, will increase from 50.0% to 60.0%.

<u>Strategies</u>

- In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will receive professional learning and collaborative planning around the progression of the content standards and the Standards for Mathematics Practice.
- In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will receive professional learning around how to establish a classroom environment that supports productive struggle.
- In order to impact mathematics performance, teachers will have opportunities to
 observe classroom instruction in another school with a similar population and
 determine potential best practices/strategies to implement in their classrooms.
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will participate in one on one data conversations and guided reading planning. ELA teachers will attend planning sessions to look at the frequency and analysis of informal running records, make the connection to Behaviors To Notice and Support and determine next instructional focus. Embedded professional learning on book choice based on instructional focus will also occur.
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will participate in professional development on effective instructional practices that Impact ELL students. Professional development will center around vocabulary and reading instruction.
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will participate in High Expectations Professional Development.
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will participate in ELA
 Professional Development that focuses on Balanced Literacy. Teachers will
 incorporate balanced literacy components into their daily lessons, thus ensuring
 that all students will have access to high expectations and rigorous curriculum.
 CCSS, data from running records/benchmark records, and anecdotal notes will
 inform instruction.
- In order to impact language arts performance, select staff will participate in school visits outside of BWES to observe high performing schools.
