HCPSS Blended Digital courses (original credit) offer a hybrid of the traditional face-to-face learning environment and independent online coursework. Students should be independent, competent readers and motivated to learn in alternative formats. Blended courses require students to have reliable access to a computer and internet connection for the duration of the course. **There will be a MANDATORY orientation on Monday, June 25 at 1:30 p.m. at Atholton High School for both sessions.**

Two online courses, Modern World History – Honors and US History G/T will be offered.

A MANDATORY orientation will be held on Monday, June 25, 1:30 p.m. at Atholton High School. In addition, students will need to take two in-person exams, one midway through the program and one at the end of the program.

Students who register for digital courses will have to complete an online orientation prior to the start of classes, in addition to the in-person orientations at the start of classes.

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Summer Institute

Grades K–4

This program provides acceleration and enrichment to students entering Grades K–4. In the morning, students take courses in reading and mathematics that provide opportunities for enhancement. The afternoon session offers enrichment opportunities with an emphasis on fun, creativity, expression and exploration in STEM, the arts, healthy lifestyles, world languages – and other project- and inquiry-based courses.

Grades 5–9

This program provides extended learning opportunities for Howard County students entering Grades 5–9 will participate in mathematics, English and – depending on grade level – science or social studies courses. They will have opportunities to participate in a wide range of enrichment experiences such as drama, African American studies, hip hop dance, journalism, art and engineering.

World Language Program

Students planning to enroll in a world language for the 2018–2019 school year may sign up for the Grades 5–9 enrichment classes for an additional fee of \$300. No student enrolled in the World Language Program will be able to transfer to the academic morning program once its enrollment is full.

Jump Start into Middle School Spanish

This course is for students who will be enrolled in Grade 6 Spanish during the 2018–2019 school year and have not had previous Spanish language instruction. The course is taught in Spanish, and students will build proficiency to communicate at the novice level.

World Language Program

Students entering Grade 8 who were not enrolled in World Language in Grade 7, may enroll in French or Spanish. This course will prepare students to enroll in the appropriate Grade 8 language course for the 2018–2019 school year. Classes with low enrollment may be canceled. Early registration is recommended.
